1. Assuming you have decided to preach a sermon series on Acts, highlight three different ways that you can structure the content of the book in order to maximise its message (6 Marks)
2. Peter and Paul can be classified as the two main characters in Acts. Briefly explain the key roles that the 2 play in Luke's overall purpose in Acts (6 marks)

3. Identify and apply the 4 main characteristics of the new prophetic community in Acts 2:41-47 (8 Marks)

4. Acts 1:8 forms the basic outline, structure and progress of Acts. With examples, discuss how this outline plays out in the whole story from Jerusalem to Rome (10 marks)
5. Peter's sermons in Acts are highly christological. Discuss 5 key themes about Christ's person and work that emerge from Peter's speeches. (10 marks)
6. In Acts chapter 6 we are introduced to a divided church – between the Hellenists and the Hebraist – but the apostles provide godly leadership that mitigates the problem. Discuss 5 key lessons that the contemporary church can learn from such apostolic wisdom. (10 marks)
7. Acts 16 models for us today a church that is made up of people from all social-cultural and economic backgrounds. Discuss with examples from the chapter. (10 marks)
