1. (a) The book of Galatians is considered as Paul's greatest and most influential. Discuss the importance of book (5 marks)

(b) In Paul's defense of justification by faith he uses the experience of Galatians (Galatians 3:1-5) as an example. What was the Galatians experience and how is it applicable today? (5marks)

(c) Paul's authorship of the letter to the Romans is universally accepted.
(1). What is the evidence of Paul's authorship? (3 marks)
(11). Who does Paul identify himself as, and what do the terms mean? (2 marks)

(d). Identify and briefly discuss the different usage of the word "flesh" in Romans (5 marks).

SECTION II: Answer Two Questions.

1. In Paul's personal defense of his authority (2:1-10), he states that he was recognized by the apostles. Explain Paul's encounter with the apostles and the significance of this recognition in light of the challenges that Paul was facing (20 marks).
2. a). Discuss the role of the Holy Spirit as he indwells a believer who is justified by faith (10marks).

(b) While Paul was motivated to write the letter to the Romans by Phoebe's intended trip to Rome (Rom 16:2), he had other reasons for writing. Discuss (10 marks).
3. In Paul's practical defense of justification by faith, one of the areas that he addresses is "a life apart from the law (Galatians 5:1-12). Discuss the implications of a believer justified by faith when he turns back to law (20 marks)
