SECTION ONE: Compulsory Questions. (30 Marks)

1. Discuss in detail the principles underpinning Christian worldview and ethical / moral philosophy, supporting your views with relevant Scriptural texts as need be. (10 Marks).
2. Suppose you are invited to give the key note speech during the inauguration and swearing in of the new Government of in your Country... In the process of your preparation, you sense a deep conviction by the Holy Spirit to speak from Exodus 20: 1 – 26; and associated Pentateuchal and their New Testament counterpart. Please exegete these texts contextually, and apply it to your audience in such a way as to create key ethical nuggets that would inform the drafting of the national service charter for your nation. (20 Marks)

SECTION TWO: Answer any THREE Questions (ONLY) in this Section. (30 Marks)

1. Describe the inadequacies of ethical relativism; and clearly delineate rational and objective philosophical frameworks necessary for global ethical discourse. (10 Marks)
2. Based on your reading of the course text by Norman L. Geisler, discuss the gist of various ethical theories, and present the distinguishing characteristics of Christian ethic. (10 Marks).
3. Sexualization of our contemporary World has broken down the traditional Judeo - Christian boundaries on sexual orientation, a move whose consequences are already too painful to enumerate! Present an ethical theology of human sexuality in a manner that contextually addresses the morbid inordinate affections in our society today. (10 Marks)
4. Discuss fully Utilitarianism, and the utilitarian theories of values. (10 Marks)
5. We argued in class that the chief good of Christian ethics is soteriological. In this regard, charter an honest personal strategy towards a *theosis* that is contextually redemptive. (10 Marks)
